Wayne Veeneman reviewed the area requested to be moved from the West Valley Fire District into the Whitefish Fire Service Area. He also reviewed the distance from the two different fire stations relative to the requested to be changed property.

Chairman Watne opened the public hearing to anyone wishing to speak in favor or opposition.

Rodney Dresbach the fire chief of West Valley Fire and Rescue. He stated that according to GIS there are two small pieces of property that are still in the West Valley Fire District that is within the requested area. He stated that they are creating confusion with the 911 system. He stated that they are creating the same problem that they currently have with the Kalispell and West Valley boundaries, and that they are checker boarding.

Mark Cahoon stated that this will save money on insurance due to the proximity to the two fire stations. He stated that they have a good relationship with the Carlson's at the Carlson's sand pit and feel they could get a quicker response.

Wes Hale stated that it does not make sense to have the fire department come from so far away when he is so close the Whitefish Fire Station.

Bent May stated that they had for years had problems with the checker boarding, but it does not make sense, with the fire hall right there and with insurance rates, to be with the West Valley Service Area.

Dick Fee stated that they have a visual out there back window of the Whitefish fire station, and for life safety and insurance cost it only makes sense to be in the Whitefish Fire Service Area.

No one else rising to speak Chairman Watne closed the public hearing.

Jonathan Smith reviewed the procedure that had been taken to go through this petition compared to the last petition that had gone through.

Rodney Dresbach stated that last time notices were sent out to everybody and he felt that at least the board of trustees should be sent notice of the public hearing.

Mark Cahoon stated that they do not believe that West Valley has a good relationship with Whitefish Fire.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has received a petition signed by owners of land in the West Valley Fire District requesting to be transferred to the Whitefish Fire Service Area;

WHEREAS, Section 7-33-2401(4), M.C.A., allows the Board of Commissioners to alter the boundaries of a fire service area;

WHEREAS, the following properties are the subject of the petition:

The following tracts in Township 30 North, Range 21 West, P.M.M., Flathead County, Montana:
Section 27 - 1+, 2+, 2-100, 3A, 3C, 3CA, 3CAB, 3CAA, 3D, 8 and 8-100,;
Section 28 - 1+, 2, 4, 5, 5C, 5F, 5G, 5H, 5J, 5K, 5L, 5M, 6, 6A, 6AA, 6B, 7, 9BA, 9BB, and Lots 1 through 5 in Arena View Subdivision;
Section 33 - 3AA, 3AB, 3B, and 6; and
Section 34 - 1+, 1-100, and 7B;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, Montana, adopted a resolution of intention (Resolution No. 1919, dated February 9, 2006) to change the boundaries of the Whitefish Fire Service Area to include the described properties within that Fire Service Area, and set a public hearing to receive general protests and comments from the public relating to the transfer of the described property into the Whitefish Fire Service Area;

WHEREAS, notice of passage of that Resolution and public hearing was published once a week for two weeks, on February 14 and February 21, 2006, and the Board of Commissioners conducted the public hearing as noticed and received input from the public on the requested transfer; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that the requested transfer would result, for the transferred property, in a more advantageous proximity to, and more advantageous communications with, the firefighting facilities of the Whitefish Fire Service Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, that the petition is granted and the properties described above are hereby transferred from the West Valley Fire District into the Whitefish Fire Service Area.

Resolution No. 1921

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, Montana, is responsible for the maintenance of public highways under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, said public highways can be seriously damaged or destroyed by deterioration, rain, snow, thawing, or other climatic conditions unless the permissible vehicle weights are reduced;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, Montana, has the authority under Section 61-10-128, M.C.A., to impose restrictions on the weight of vehicles traveling on public roads under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the public safety requires the immediate imposition of limits on county roads as an emergency measure to prevent accidents and damage to property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, Montana, pursuant to Section 61-10-128, M.C.A., that the following load limits shall apply until further order of the Board.

Load limit single axle 7 tons, tandem axle 14 tons, 350 lbs. per inch width of tire, however, at no time will the weight exceed 14,000 lbs. per single axle and 28,000 lbs. per tandem axle. Speed limit as posted.

Load limit single axle 8 tons, tandem axle 16 tons, 400 lbs. per inch width of tire, however, at no time will the weight exceed 16,000 lbs. per single axle and 32,000 lbs. per tandem axle. Speed limit as posted.

The load limit on the following roads shall be 350 to 400 pounds per inch of tire width as marked as well as 35 miles per hour speed limit: (If a particular road on this list has not been marked then no load limit is imposed at this time.)
