Bob Sandman the area manager of the Dept of Natural Resources and Conservation in Kalispell introduced the staff that attended with him: DC Haas, Fire Program Manager in Kalispell, Doug Williams, State Rural Fire Coordinator, Steve Frye, Area Operations Manager for NW Montana, Greg Poncin, Unit Manager in Kalispell and Dan Cassidy, Fire & Service Forestry Manager. The land offices involved include Kalispell, Libby, Olney, Plains, Goat Creek in the Swan and also a satellite office in Polson. He spoke briefly about the fire service arena over the past 20 years being highly complex and stated that it has gotten to where they are operating on an inter agency basis and in most instances have multi jurisdictional responsibilities. It was stated that the plan over the next year is that they would like to be able to maximize there contribution within the arena in Flathead County, and the way they are proposing to do that is to increase and improve their communication with the other jurisdictions that they operate with.

DC Haas, Fire Program Manager for the Kalispell unit spoke about fire protection within Flathead County and the area that consists of direct protection is 720,000. It was stated that direct protection overlaps most of the rural fire departments responsibilities including West Valley, Smith Valley and Creston. He then stated that they would like to see a more professional aggressive training program with the rural, state, park and forest service all training together.

Bob Sandman spoke about the cooperative agreement being different than the annual operating plan and stated that the cooperative agreement is a stand alone document between the county and DNRC. He then explained that it is an agreement where they offer training and equipment in exchange for protection of some parcels.

Bob Sidman spoke in regards to the agreement being the mechanism that they use to tap into state funds if a fire goes beyond the counties capability.

DC Haas spoke in regards to the county agreeing to protect certain areas that don't have fire service in exchange for DNRC providing training and equipment when and where they can. He then stated that the contract they have now is out of date.

Bob Sidman spoke about DNRC still moving forward with training and will continue to, and then stated that the document still needs to be updated from 1989.

DC Haas spoke about DNRC mission being to maximum there contribution to Flathead County to the fire service operations.

Commissioner Brenneman made a **motion** to approve the Notice of Public Hearing for Saddlehorn PUD and authorize the Chairman to sign. Commissioner Hall **seconded** the motion. **Aye** - Watne, Hall and Brenneman. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, Montana, hereby gives notice pursuant to Section 3.31.020.4 of the Flathead County Zoning Regulations, that it will hold a public hearing to consider a request by Swan Mountain Partners, LLC, to approve a Planned Unit Development (PUD) in the Bigfork Zoning District.

The area proposed to be overlaid with a PUD is zoned in the SAG-5 (Suburban Agricultural) classification and is described as Assessor's Tracts 7, 8, and 8a in Section 31 of Township 27 North, Range 19 West, P.M.M., Flathead County, Montana. The property is located on Ranch Road to the east of the intersection of Montana Highway 35 and Montana Highway 209, Bigfork, Montana.

The proposal would overlay approximately 240 acres to be developed into 106 developable lots, including 96 single-family units, 7 commercial lots, 2 recreation lots, and 1 maintenance lot. In addition, 9 lots designated for future development are contemplated by the plan, along with 17 common areas. The deviations from the SAG-5 zoning classification requirements are related to the allowance of mixed uses, including central maintenance facilities, transportation center, fire and emergency facilities, employee housing, commercial use and higher density for residential use.

The regulations defining the PUD requirements and the SAG-5 zoning classification are contained in the Flathead County Zoning Regulations, on file for public inspection at the Office of the County Clerk and Recorder, Courthouse, Kalispell, Montana, in Permanent File No. 93270 13500. Documents detailing the proposed PUD are available for public inspection at the Office of the County Clerk and Recorder, 800 South Main, Kalispell, Montana, and at the Flathead County Zoning and Planning Office, 1035 1st Avenue West, Kalispell, Montana.

The public hearing will be held on the **15th day of November, 2006, at 9:30 o'clock a.m.**, in the Office of the Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, Courthouse, West Annex, Kalispell, Montana. At the public hearing, the Board of Commissioners will give the public an opportunity to be heard regarding the proposed PUD overlay in the Bigfork Zoning District.

Chairman Watne opened the public comment on matters within the Commissions' Jurisdiction.

Keith Bassett spoke about an article that was published in the newspaper in regards to the growth in the Kila area. He stated that he is directly below the proposed subdivision and feels that it will be paradise lost. He also spoke about the density of the subdivision and the effects that it will have. He stated that he has lived there for 21 years and his neighbor has been there for 25 years, being the oldest member of the Smith Lake Vista Water District that was established in 1973. He went through minutes from the Water Board that dated back to 1973 up to 2001 and the history of the struggle for members to find water, and read several letters that gave a brief history of Smith Lake Water District. He stated that when the expensive home builders run out of water and he runs out of water below them with prior water rights, then they will be closed down.

Dick Reed spoke about owning 40 acres underneath the Greywolf Subdivision and is questioning how paving Spring Hill Road would make it safer. He stated that it won't make it safer, that it would make it worse, because when you hit the blacktop it is a sheet of ice. He also stated that if they are going to make it a safe road they need to cut the top off and fill in the valleys and leave it gravel.

Mark Johnson spoke about his concerns in regards to traffic issues, specifically the dust on Spring Hill Road. He stated that the dust is overwhelming in the summer with the development that is occurring there now. He also stated that he was against further subdivisions being approved in the Kila area due to air quality issues and spoke about the construction traffic concerns on Kila Road. He then stated that he has seen many accidents, specifically below the cliffs where there are no guardrails and he is asking that these issues be addressed before any more subdivisions are approved in the Kila area.

Barbara Ogrews property borders the proposed subdivision and she spoke about her concern with the water. She stated that her well is 600 feet deep and that she gets about 10 gallons per minute. She spoke about the water being a real hit and miss situation where she is one of the lucky ones, but is concerned about them having water with the 17 wells below her. She also spoke about her concern with wildlife disappearing as the land is developed and then spoke about the condition of the road. It was also stated that she is concerned about personal property rights and she would like the Commissioners to look at the density of the subdivision.

Jacqueline Works spoke about the property that she lives on that borders the Greywolf Subdivision and she stated that for many months she had been in opposition to the development. She pointed out that her main concern is with fire and her developer left her trapped with the only way out being the way in and she spoke about the fire suppression tanks from Greywolf protecting them. It was also noted that the developer very generously offered at his expense to put a gated passage way to allow fire trucks in and that he would also allow them access to the code to get to the tanks quicker. She then spoke about the density not being out of character with what is already going on, with 90 acres containing 14 parcels and this being 40 acres which contain 7 parcels, and questioned why one was okay, but not the other. It was stated that the minimum standard on water from DEQ is 4 GPM, for 4 hours for a residential home and for the number of wells that are there now and their output you basically have a 1 out of 3 chance to get a well that will meet DEQ requirements. Another issue she talked about was the 17 new homes put in since 2001 that have been an impact on the road and stated that 22 more homes will be another impact on the road, but the developer has offered to pay for a portion of improvements on Spring Hill Road as well as No Name Road. In closing she spoke about the fire protection being the most important and then stated that someday she will be very grateful for Greywolf for the improvements and benefits to the community and she is asking that they approve the subdivision.

Valerie Kurtzhaes stated that she has a 28 acre certified tree farm very close to the subdivision and spoke about the proposal being a perfect example of how growth should not occur. She then stated that the development is in a high fire hazard location

on mountainous terrain with only one way in and one way out; with that being Spring Hill Road. She spoke about a complete and adequate environmental assessment not being done, and stated that Mr. Spratt's EA study said very little about the water issue which was the principal concern discussed at public comment. She stated that it left little assurance that the water could be tapped into without affecting her well. She also spoke of Mr. Spratt presenting his review to the Planning Board and predicting that most wells in Greywolf would get about 5 to 10 GPM; but given the very minimum yields surrounding the subdivision 50% of the wells are producing less than 2 GPM now and for Mr. Spratt to say that the wells are going to be between 5 to 10 GPM for 17 wells is not very convincing. She noted that out of a total of 54 parcels 30 of them don't have wells, so that is a huge issue with them having 30 more wells. She stated that she hopes that they don't approve the subdivision, and if they do under no circumstances should it be without a public water system to protect those with senior water rights

Diane Sande a resident on Spring Hill Road lives beside the 22 acres and spoke about her water being less than 1 GPM and stated that she went to the meeting that the developer had and she appreciated the fact that he told her he would re-drill her well. She stated that you can re-drill all you want, but if you have already used the water you will not get any water. She also spoke about the fire hazard Stoltz left behind them where they use to be able to go from Spring Hill Road over the top to Coon Hollow Road before the road was kelly humped. She stated that if they had a back road to get out of then great, at least she could get out, but no one else could.

Daniel Moore spoke in regards to the approval of Haskill Meadow Ranch with 74 lots on 530 acres with another approximately 2,000 acres in limbo adjoining that. It was stated that there is a proposal before them for 17 lots on 90 acres with approximately 400 plus acres adjoining this that is in limbo. He spoke about the lots coming down to approximately 5 acres in size and he stated that the density is too incredibly high. He then spoke about the land being deer and elk wintering range, and he then quoted from the master plan section 4.7 saying, that there should only be 1 home per 20 acres in winter range areas. He stated that the density issue would help address a lot of these issues. He spoke about this subdivision getting an okay and then the others that are still in limbo waiting behind would vastly increase the demand on the infrastructure, road systems, schools, water, fire and police service in the Kila area. He also stated that growth is inevitable and they need to think about how it's going to affect them in the future by looking down the road. He spoke about property values and property taxes driving out the long time residents, as they will be taxed out of the area and he then stated that Kila is a rural area and is not a suburb of Kalispell and they want it to remain that way.

Colleen Wade spoke about hearing a lot about property rights and then stated that it is her understanding that in our system, subdivision of land is a privilege that a landowner enjoys after demonstrating compliance with the rules, regulations, requirements, guidelines and the laws governing the act of subdividing. She stated that there is a system of checks and balances in place to insure compliance and that the system begins with the Planning Office and goes to the Planning Board and then to the Commissioners. It was stated that the proposal before you has failed to gain recommendation at the first two check points and she then stated that if it is approved here today at the third check point after failing the first two; she would have to ask why the system isn't working based on the information and recommendations they have received, which clearly demonstrated the failure of this proposal to meet requirements designed to insure the health, safety and welfare of the people.

Kip Drobish spoke in regards to being in view of the Haskill Mountain Ranch proposal and spoke about feeling frustrated in regards to what use is it to give testimony to the Commission, when it seems like it's a court that is not working. His objective is that he would like to see them running backwards on the dumb growth that is going on in Flathead County with not much vision. He stated that in recent years property values have sky rocketed which has attracted a feeding frenzy from the development sector. He then spoke about Haskill Mountain Ranch and Greywolf both being precedent settings for the Kila area, and then stated that your approval of the subdivision without adequate water, transportation and environmental assessments reduces the communities' ability to come together on a vision. He then stated that he would appreciate it if they would reject it and spoke about there being a lot of problems on the Preliminary Plat that will cost the county a lot of money.

Jonathan Baum spoke about spending the last year gathering information from neighbors and the developer and stated that it's a sticky situation, but the facts have been stated and he hopes they have done their homework and looked at them. He is concerned as a community about what this growth will do and stated that overall the commissioners make the final decision. He spoke about an article in the Daily Inter Lake that states that the counties recent string of lawsuits victories came to a sudden end, that the ruin would require developers to provide a more thorough analysis of the potential impacts on their projects. The main contention in the lawsuit was the EA that was submitted with the application, when it failed to address all the items required by law in the description of potential impacts was inadequate. He stated that he still feels that the EA is sub par. Judge Curtis who is hearing it stated that there are numerous reasons why the legislator required the applicant to provide information in an EA, one being that the burden should not be placed on the public. He stated that the burden has already been placed and everyone who has spoken today has been working to figure this out. He spoke about spending countless hours month after month doing his research and what he has come to is that the EA is inadequate and doesn't reflect accumulative growth. He stated that he feels if they deny this proposal that this developer has invested enough that he will resubmit because he does feel there can be a happy medium. He also feels there should be further research on the implications.

Rick Breckenridge spoke in regards to the subdivision being an opportunity to those who have discussed problems with Spring Hill Road. He stated that there is an opportunity to rectify the situation with the road if they choose to do an RSID, which would help solve the problem on Spring Hill road. He then stated that since 1987 the master plan update has identified Spring Hill Road as a problematic area and the county has not addressed it; but today there are people in the room who want to solve the problem and they have a developer who wants to work with them in solving the problem. He is encouraging them as they did in Haskill Basin to get the problematic area resolved.

Florence O'Neal spoke in regards to not having anything more to say than what they have already heard or read perhaps numerous times about the concerns the Kila neighbors have about the Greywolf development. She stated that they have been given the facts and figures regarding the impact on wildlife and stated that the project is non-compliant with the issues of density related to the Flathead County Master Plan. She also spoke about her concerns with the roads and other issues including and perhaps the most disturbing, the concerns about water; therefore she is urging them to seriously consider the consequences to the community and its residents. She then stated that she is another Kila resident saying please do not approve the Greywolf development as it is currently proposed.

Mark Spratt from RLK Hydro spoke about the water issue and stated that the aquifer that provides water for the subdivision is a fractured bedrock aquifer and is the only ground water source available. He spoke about several other small streams in the area and about Smith Lake, which is at the toe of the water shed. He stated that the well depths in the area range from 82- 903 feet deep and that there are 38 wells within the water shed that contribute to the system. The reported well yields range from 0-45 GPM with the average being 11 GPM. He stated that the annual average recharge using standard methods is about 906 acre feet of water, which is new water added to the ground water system annually. With the existing and proposed appropriations out there now, plus the proposed 163 acre feet for this project, the best estimate total consumptive use is about 121 acre feet. What

this all means is that we would be looking at water use of about 14 – 18 percent of the average annual recharge. This means there would be more water added to the system every year on average than what would be used by a substantial margin. He stated that in order to verify that water is available at the site a well was drilled on lot 17 at the spot indicated in the proposal, just to see what would happen. They were able to do a 4 hour constant rate test with 8 GPM, which exceeds the DEQ standard of 6 GPM for 2 hours and that this demonstrates that the well does meet DEQ requirements. This data was used to project a draw down based on 12 hours of pumping which would be an excessive level of consumption for a domestic well being used for domestic purposes. The results showed less than half a foot of draw down at 500 feet from the well. Given the well depth this is not likely to interfere with the use of an existing well.

Chairman Watne questioned how deep the well was that was giving 8 GPM.

Mark Spratt stated that he thought it was around 400 feet.

Commissioner Hall questioned the letter from the fire chief requesting two recharge facilities for the subdivision. What they are asking for is to have a float valve that would automatically fill the tanks as used if there was a fire and questioned Mark Spratt as to if there was enough water to have two 24,000 gallon capacity tanks and be able to recharge them.

Mark Spratt then stated that he does feel that there is and said to remember that they are for fire, so most of the time the water is in storage and so any time they would be pumped the pumping would be going on to fill them in the event of a fire and even at 8 GPM they are talking 9,000 gallons plus a day.

Commissioner Brenneman questioned the acre feet and asked Mark to go through it with him and then said the average annual precipitation is 20" and 20% goes to ground water (4 inches) and that equals 900 acre feet per year.

Mark Spratt then stated that the recharge to the ground water system comes from the entire water shed with the bulk of the recharge occurring near the ridge tops, with the same thing being true on the valley floor.

Jonathan Baum spoke in regards to the Planning Board meeting where Mark Spratt was asked by the Board if there was enough water for 17 homes in the condensed area, and he stated that there should be; but then he would recommend that there not be allowed irrigation. He stated that this doesn't add up, that if there was enough water to put into these cylinders for fire suppression yet people can't irrigate. He then said if we have done our homework we know this is an extreme fire hazard area and they need to put some time and energy into this. He spoke about Rick Breckenridge's comment about working on things, and then stated as a citizen and someone who plans on living in this area for a long time he stated that RSID's are a time bomb for our children and he is not into putting the taxes off to his children to have to pay for a road.

No one else rising to speak, Chairman Watne closed the public comment period.

Lopez-Stickney reviewed the application submitted by Gary Rood for Preliminary Plat approval of Greywolf Subdivision with technical assistance from Montana Mapping. The subdivision proposes to create 17 single family residential lots on 90 acres in the Kila Battle Butte Master Plan area with 23 attached conditions. Staff does have concerns about the water availability in the area. It was stated that Planning Staff can't support the subdivision because of the water condition and also the condition of Spring Hill Road. The motion failed on a 4-4 vote from the Planning Board

Rick Breckenridge spoke in regards to the Planning Staff inserting their opinion and not the opinion of the Planning Board.

Jeff Harris stated that since the Planning Board did not make a recommendation and since in there discussion with the Planning Board following the Public Hearing, staff acknowledged that they would not support the subdivision. He stated the vote was a 4-4 split and that they knew that staff didn't support the application.

DC Haas spoke on the subdivision rules and standards. It was stated that he was asked to come to the meeting because of some confusion over the requirements and what can be required of subdivision regulations verses 3.20, which is fire protection and 3.21 which is high fire hazard area.

Commissioner Brenneman questioned the water supply according to the DNRC fire suppression requirements.

Lopez-Stickney spoke about the area being an extreme fire hazard area with one way in on Spring Hill Road.

Commissioner Brenneman stated that he could not support it.

Commissioner Hall stated that through conditions it could be mitigated and that condition 15 being a public water system to serve all 17 lots, is one that he would not be willing to compromise on.

Rick Breckenridge spoke about the key areas of concern being the service into the road, water, items placed on the final plat, fire suppression, covenants and spoke of mitigation measures.

Lopez-Stickney spoke about there being 2 accesses to re-align with No Name Road and the condition in the staff report is to upgrade Spring Hill Road also to county standards and stated there is a letter from Mr. DeJana in regards to this.

Discussion was held in regards to Torto Loop and it was stated that the Planning Board has removed the condition.

Shane Abernathy spoke in regards to Torto Loop and stated that he had met with some about there concerns and was willing to put in a gate for fire suppression safety and made some clarification about Torto Loop. He also spoke about a blanket easement on the property.

Rick Breckenridge then stated that there are 50 wells on record and only 1 is a dry hole; he then stated that if they do hit a dry well they will do a public water system.

Commissioner Brenneman stated that with all these suggestions brought before the Commission, none of which have been seen by the Planning Board to comment on, or to be able to give an accurate representation of, that perhaps the application should be withdrawn and presented to the Planning Board so that they can comment on it. He stated that they have made excellent points in mitigating some of the issues, but with all the changes it is like a new proposal and the Planning Board hasn't seen it.

Rick Breckenridge stated that the changes came out of the Public Hearing.

Lopez-Stickney stated that they received the changes on October 18, 2006.

Rick Breckenridge spoke about condition 15 that states that they would put the wells in and condition #16 would tighten up the standard verbiage.

Jeff Harris spoke in regards to condition 16 being that if one thing didn't work they would try another.

Rick Breckenridge spoke about condition 17 being a direct result of the proposed changes in conditions 15 & 16. Condition 21 with the fire protection subdivision regulations of the addition of 500 gallons sustained for 2 hours, is an either or condition in the regulations. He spoke about the fire recharge being consistent with past practices of this board and the Planning Office in that they either have storage tanks or we have a pumping facility, not both. He would like the condition to be read as directed by the Smith Valley Fire Chief.

Commissioner Brenneman stated that he knows there are several that have the storage tanks and the pump.

Rick Breckenridge then stated that it does require a pump, but not one that would pump 500 gallons sustained for 2 hours.

Lopez-Stickney then clarified a condition that was originally on the report and was sub sequentially amended by the Planning Board and also spoke about garbage disposal.

Commissioner Brenneman spoke about the Planning Board not having seen the proposal as it is now.

Chairman Watne questioned if they would consider continuing the Preliminary Plat.

Commissioner Hall made a motion to continue the Preliminary Plat. Chairman Watne **seconded** the motion. **Aye** – Watne and Hall. **Opposed** – Brenneman. Motion carried by quorum.

At 5:00 o'clock P.M., the Board continued the session until 8:00 o'clock A.M. on November 1, 2006.
