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## TUESDAY, JANUARY 30, 2007

The Board of County Commissioners met in continued session at 8:00 o'clock A.M. Chairman Brenneman, Commissioners Hall and Lauman, and Clerk Robinson were present.

### **Chairman Brenneman opened the public comment on matters within the Commissions' Jurisdiction.**

Those present Pam Holmquist, Jeff Larsen, Charles Lapp, Clarice Ryan, David Hilde, Mayre Flowers, Trevor Schaefer, Jack Fallon and Clerk Monica Eisenzimer

Jeff Larsen began by introducing himself as a Civil Engineer and Planning board member, he went on to say there are a few things that the Commissioners did with the Growth Policy that he approves of and was questioning "Municipal standards" and what municipal's standards they would go by. Larsen further added that the engineers had recommended that Municipal standards be amended to be set to DEQ standards and also spoke of his concern with the 8 feet vs. 5 feet to ground water.

Clarice Ryan spoke on behalf of the Bigfork Land Use Advisory Committee in regards to Chapter 10 in the Growth Policy. She stated that the standards seem pretty high with 60 percent of the residents and 40 percent of the land owners and questioned why the neighborhood plans would be more stringent than possibly the county. Also questioned were policies 43.5, 43.8 and 43.9.

Pam Holmquist spoke of her concern with the ground water surface and the change to 8 feet, which she feels should be changed back to 5 if not 4, because of state statues. Also discussed was the map in regards to ground water and it was questioned if that would be taken out and replaced by another map that would show them where they stand with the surface water. It was then stated that with local, state, federal and tribal water quality standards in place to protect our water it was questioned if we need goal 39 in the Growth Policy.

Jack Fallon spoke on goal 39 in regards to state statue covering the areas referenced in 39 and then stated that he feels it should be eliminated. He then stated that when DEQ is responsible for certain areas as well as other statues, it is best to refer to them and have them be the default instead of being so restrictive.

Mayre Flowers asked that Joe Russell assist with the changes that were suggested regarding groundwater requirements and also that Jim Hansen from the City to provide them with advice regarding the changes that were recommended in regards to the ground water. Flowers then stated that she supports the 8 feet and is also concerned with maps and would like the 87 map to be used until the developmental predictability map is in place.

Charles Lapp commented regarding the 5 feet to 8 feet groundwater and spoke of the discussion that is going on south west of Kalispell with storm water and drainage. Lapp then stated that DEQ does not look over the plans that the City of Kalispell approves because they are responsible, whereas in the county the DEQ and Health Department looks them over.

### **Commissioner Brenneman closed the public comment period, and suggested that anyone else wishing to address the Commission, return tomorrow for further comment.**

Crowley asked the commission if they would support a bond issue if the site can be secured. Commissioner Hall expressed his support for a bond issue if it saves the taxpayers when buying an existing building. Commissioner Lauman offered support as long as there is a plan and the board is doing fundraising. Chairman Brenneman repeated support in the before mentioned plan.

Discussion continued regarding funding for future county projects and fundraising plans.

Commissioner Brenneman stated that the meeting today is to continue the consideration of changes to the Growth Policy.

Commissioner Hall thanked staff for their tireless efforts and the planning board for their many, many hours of review of over 1,000 comments.

Commissioner Lauman emphasized that this is a process not a project that is on going and can be revised and changed after a 6 month review.

### **Chapter 9**

- Part 1, IV, Existing Land Use Instruments, Zoning, under Agriculture, Timberlands, Residential, Commercial, Industrial, Planned Unit Developments, Neighborhood Plan will be changed to; specific zoning in existence at the time of this document. The last sentence will be taken out.
- Part 1, IV, Existing Land Use Instruments, Neighborhood Plans in existence will be incorporated in the county Growth Policy and recognized as a Neighborhood Plan. Neighborhood Plans will be changed to; Existing Neighborhood Plans should be reviewed for their consistency with the provisions of Chapter 10 of this document. Implementation of Neighborhood Plans must then be reviewed for adequacy in promoting the goals and policies of the plan. Implementation of Neighborhood Plans must then be reviewed for-adequacy in promoting the goals and policies of the plan. Neighborhood plans should then be re-adopted as addendums to the Flathead County Growth Policy.
- Part 1, IV, Existing Land Use Instruments, Special Consideration Areas will be put back in.
- Part 1, V, Development Rights, add a new bullet below that will say: Community Character Based Land Use Systems, Community character based land use systems attempt to define and map general land use types such as urban, suburban and rural. They then go on to describe the type of development that is compatible in terms of size and density, but not use with each land use type. A fundamental objective of this type of system is to preserve the character of an area and enhance it where possible. To allow development but to assure that the development is consistent with that character. They establish standards and criteria for land development that will remain and enhance specific character types, urban, suburban and rural in designated areas. These systems have been successfully utilized in western counties that are also concerned with maintaining the identity of rural communities.

### **Chapter 10**

- Introduction, after MCA will be changed to: Each Neighborhood Plan must be consistent with the Growth Policy. Land use decisions will be guided by the Growth Policy and existing regulatory documents. The intent of this chapter is to provide a general framework to facilitate the preparation of Neighborhood Plans.
- Goal 43 will be changed to: A clear majority of the landowners and residents, desiring a Neighborhood Plan in lands presently under the county's jurisdiction without a Neighborhood Plan, may develop a Neighborhood Plan.

- Goal 44 will be changed to: Honor the integrity and purpose of existing Neighborhood Plans respecting the time and effort of the community involvement that has taken place.
- Policy 44.1 will be changed to: Previously existing Neighborhood Plans are to remain in effect until revised by the Flathead County Board of Commissioners, are hereby incorporated into the Growth Policy as addendums to it and are deemed consistent with the existing Growth Policy.
- Policy 44.2 will be changed to: Existing Neighborhood Plans will be reviewed by the Flathead County Planning Board and Zoning Office to determine whether Flathead County and the landowners in the Neighborhood Plan area should update the Neighborhood Plan. This review may be part of the statutorily required 5 year review or may occur sooner.
- Policy 44.3 will be changed to: If the Flathead County Planning and Zoning Office determines that a Neighborhood Plan should be updated, then the planning staff may, at the request of the County Commissioners or majority of the Planning Board initiate an amendment to the Neighborhood Plan.
- Policy 44.4 will be changed to: Simplified subdivision and development review processes, once developed by Flathead County for Neighborhood Plan areas, will apply to the areas included in the existing Neighborhood Plans.
- Policy 43.4 will be changed to: Develop expedited and simplified subdivision and development review processes for lands within an approved Growth Policy consistent Neighborhood Plan. Will now be 43.1.
- Policy 43.8 will be changed to: A clear majority of both landowners and acreage represented within the established boundaries described in Step 1 of the neighborhood planning process should be in support of a proposed Neighborhood Plan. Steps 1 through 6 of the neighborhood planning process outlined in Chapter 10 establish a mechanism by which if a clear majority of the landowners do not support a Neighborhood Plan, the Planning Board can recommend denial of the plan to the commissioners due to a lack of support. This check and balance mechanism is further protected by Policy 43.9 allowing landowners recourse if a Neighborhood Plan is adopted by the Commissioners but deemed undesirable by 40 percent of the landowners or 50 percent of the acreage included.
- Part 2, The Neighborhood Planning Process will be changed to: A steering committee will be formed with member's representative of the land ownership within the proposed Neighborhood Plan.
- Policy 43.9 will be changed to: If 40 percent of landowners within the Neighborhood Plan area whose names appear on the last completed assessment role or if landowners representing 50 percent of acreage included, sign a protest petition to the Neighborhood Plan within 90 days after adoption by the county commissioners, the plan shall become null and void.
- Policy 43.10 will be changed to: An advisory committee, which represents diverse elements of the plan area, approved by the county commission comprised of landowners and residents living in the plan area should be established for each approved Neighborhood Plan. Previously existing Neighborhood Plans are to remain in effect until revised by the Flathead County Board of Commissioners, are hereby incorporated as addendums to the Growth Policy.
- Part 1, Neighborhood Plans in General, 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph will be changed to: Neighborhood plans may contain a variety of elements that work toward identifying preserving and protecting local characteristics, that define the community while planning for and accommodating inevitable growth. Neighborhood plans provide an opportunity to foster a sense of community by identifying current trends and future of a local area. Elements that may be included in a Neighborhood Plan follow.
- Part 2, The Neighborhood Planning Process will be changed to: The neighborhood planning process outlined below applied to communities pursuing a new neighborhood plan after adoption of this Growth Policy. See part 6 of this chapter for more on the review of existing Neighborhood Plans.
- Part 2, 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph will be changed to: Each step must be conducted with opportunity for public input and engagement. The neighborhood planning process is summarized in the Overview of Neighborhood Planning Process. County planning staff is expected to work with communities, to provide guidance and assistance with the planning process. The success of the planning effort depends on the amount of meaningful public participation.
- Part 2, The Neighborhood Planning Process, Step 1 will be changed to: A steering committee will be formed with membership representative of the land ownership within the proposed Neighborhood Plan area.
- Part 2, The Neighborhood Planning Process, Step 4 will be changed to: That consideration will include written notification to landowners in the plan appearing on the most recent assessment list informing them of the plan's content.
- Part 2, The Neighborhood Planning Process, Step 6, last sentence, will be taken out.
- Part 3, Land Categories, first sentence will be taken out.
- Part 3, Land Categories, 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph will be changed to: Existing plans must similarly accommodate and guide all appropriate types of growth. Existing plans do not have to follow the categorization methods outlined below.
- Part 3, Step B, Assign appropriate uses in each land type, end of the paragraph, will be changed to: Existing Neighborhood Plans do not have to follow the categorization methods outlined below. See Part 6 of this chapter for more on the review of existing Neighborhood Plans.
- Part 6, Existing Neighborhood Plans, first paragraph, will be changed to: There are 18 approved neighborhoods, local or regional land use plans within unincorporated Flathead County. The intent of these plans is to capture the intent and vision of the neighborhoods and local community and provide guidance for the future. Some of these plans may be out dated and may need revision to reflect current conditions and future vision for the neighborhood areas.
- Part 6, Existing Neighborhood Plans, to be added after 1<sup>st</sup> paragraph: Factors to consider in whether a Neighborhood Plan should be updated are how long ago the Neighborhood Plan was adopted by Flathead County, whether the landowners in the Neighborhood Plan area have been attempting to implement the Neighborhood Plan, whether the

Neighborhood Plan continues to represent the vision and goals of the community, and whether the Neighborhood Plan remains an adequate and appropriate planning tool in light of the goals and policies of the Growth Policy.
