
ARBA Rabbit Show at Fairgrounds

Thank You Procedure for All Large Livestock Members

First off, we'd like to thank Brian Bay, FFA advisor, for working so hard to make the 4H/FFA thank you photo's so great this year. He did a wonderful job! Pictures are ready in the Extension Office for members to pick up at their earliest convenience.



When a 4H member comes into the Extension Office, for their photo, they will find a form attached to their packet. This form will have a place for your buyer to sign and date, as well as a place for the buyer to list what they received for a thank you. It is the members responsibility to have your buyer fill out and sign the form, and it is the members responsibility to return it to the Extension Office or your FFA Advisor by December 1st, 2008. Those who do not have their form returned to the Extension Office or a FFA Advisor by December 1st, will not be allowed to take an animal to the Fair the following year. **There will be no exceptions to this guideline**". If you buyer chooses to take the form and mail it themselves, please be sure to verify that the Extension Office has received it. If you receive your payment in the mail, it is still your responsibility to take a thank you and your photo to the buyer and have your form filled out. If you have any questions, please contact the Extension Office at 758-5553. It is important that we thank those who are so generous to our organizations. Vileka Fisher Tells Us More About MSU Horse Camp

We'd like to apologize to Vileka for misquoting her in the last months newsletter. Vileka was kind enough to clarify a couple points that were missed. Instead of "There was one instructor for every three students. We were grouped according to age and ability..." the line should have read: "There was one chaperone for every 5 students. The entire school (31 students) was split into two groups. There was one riding instructor per group." In last months newsletter, we were unable to include information provided by Julie Hager, the MSU Horse Camp Director. Here is the completion of the article. "This was our 6th School. The first one had 12 students. We've been full (50 students maximum) every year since and usually have a waiting list. We have students come from all over the state as well as California, Washington, Oregon, and Wyoming. This year, due to gas prices, some students had to pull out or could not sign up, therefore, we had 31 students. The Horsemanship School is always held the last week of June. Students ages 9-18 are welcome to register. Each day the students have 4 hours of riding instruction, intermixed with 4 hours of workshops (in the past these have included: polo, goat tying, roping, vet care and first aid, "build your own tack," barrel racing, bareback riding, trails, showmanship, etc.) In addition to the daily instruction, the student also have 2 evenings of riding games – such as a rodeo night or trails & obstacle course – and 2 evenings of "off horse" activities (pizza party and swimming) We have AWESOME instructors each year. Because our staff is all voluntary and we have a host of sponsors to assist with additional costs, we keep the cost of the camp as low as possible, so each youth in Montana who wishes to attend may. Currently, the registration fee is \$300 (\$330 with chaperone fee). I expect to see a slight increase in next year's registration fees, as the dorm room rental rates are increasing. We had an anonymous donor this year offer a full scholarship, and Galt Ranch Quarter Horses also donated some scholarships. We will hopefully be able to offer at least one scholarship again next year, keep looking for information from your county office." Brochures and info are usually sent out around February. Time to Turn in Records!

September 30th is the official end of the 2007-2008 4-H year. If you are an **independent member**, you must have your records and workbooks turned into the Extension Office no later than Tuesday, September 30th, 2008 to be checked off.

Those of you involved in clubs need to speak to your 4-H Club leader to find out when your records are due. Anyone in a club must turn in their records to their Club Leader by the date that the Club leader stipulates, which usually is in the end of September or the beginning of October. Project records need to be completed in order to be eligible for market livestock projects in the upcoming year and various county trips and awards. For all Leaders, if you need a new club print out of your members and their projects, please contact us and we will print one out for you. We have gold seals and check off sheets ready in the office for you to pick up. Also remember, I can't put together award packets without a list from you stating which members in your club completed their 4-H year. Attention Club Leaders: End Of Year Award Packets

Most clubs plan achievement night and year end award ceremonies in November. End of year award packets will be available on Tuesday, October 28th, 2008. If your club needs your packet in place before that date, please call the Extension Office to make other arrangements. To put these packets together, we need a list of all of the members in each club that have completed their 4-H year and should receive an award. We can't put your packet together without this list. If you do not preregister by that date, you will not have a reserved slot in the program and will have to be put on the waiting list.

November 10th: Club enrollment packets are due back into the Extension Office.

December 10th: Club outlines are due in the Extension Office.
