Steele explained Flathead County River Commission is officially being dissolved and re-organized under the Flathead Conservation District.

Commissioner Holmquist made a **motion** to approve Resolution 2203B. Commissioner Lauman **seconded** the motion. **Aye -** Dupont, Lauman and Holmquist. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2203B

WHEREAS, the Flathead County Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution No. 2203 on April 29, 2009, establishing the Flathead County River Commission, which consisted of nine members;

WHEREAS, the Flathead County River Commission was created to develop strategies for improving water quality in the Flathead River and its tributaries, to endeavor to achieve grants to fund and implement such strategies, and to advise the Flathead County Board of Commissioners from time to time on matters of Flathead River water quality;

WHEREAS, Flathead County obtained a grant of \$23,000.00 from the Montana Department of Environmental Quality (D.E.Q.) to support activities of the Flathead County River Commission, which included evaluating impacts on agriculture as well as education and outreach activities;

WHEREAS, at a meeting in February 2011, several members of the Flathead County River Commission resigned;

WHEREAS, at a Flathead Conservation District meeting on March 14, 2011, the Flathead County River Commission was re-organized and accepted by the Flathead Conservation District;

WHEREAS, County Commissioner Pamela Holmquist remained on the newly re-organized Flathead River Commission; and

WHEREAS, the D.E.Q. grant to Flathead County was closed out and the remaining grant money of \$8,400.00 reverted back to the D.E.Q.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of Flathead County, Montana, hereby rescinds Resolution No. 2230 and dissolves the Flathead County River Commission.
