He further reviewed work still pending on the potential expansion project. In other business, he spoke about the need for three additional FTE to staff sites at Somers and Creston; reviewed construction timelines for the Olney and Essex sites; reviewed operation statistics, and explained an RFP regarding recycling is being reviewed by the County Attorney's Office for distribution.

General discussion was held relative to the Bigfork container site, concern regarding a policy only allowing a five-year recycling contract, and potential of a future tax rate increase down the road.

Prunty reported Norm Kuennen has been working with Plum Creek to obtain an historic right-of-way easement through two sections on Sickler Creek Road very close to the Rogers Lake area. He explained after review by the Plat Room it was found the County Commissioners declared the road a county road in December 1908. He noted the portion considered starts on Highway 2 near Rogers Lake Road, and goes all the way through to Sickler Creek Road where it comes out past Marion.

Kuennen said the state took title on Section 30 in 1895 and Section 36 in 1898 so the declaration would have no material effect on the ownership. In order to perfect the rights he explained an easement would need to be granted on the trust lands for that purpose. The process DNRC would follow in negotiating with Plum Creek was reviewed.

Prunty explained currently this section of road is an unmaintained right-of-way and securing an easement would not change anything from the Road Departments point of view.

Kuennen noted the lands are trust lands that have very specific constitutional and statutory requirements for compensation for use.

Prunty noted action from the commission would be needed when the easement comes back. He said at this point we are looking at whether Flathead County is interested in letting Plum Creek and Norm Kuennen go through this work when it's all said and done.

Kuennen said he did not want to invest the time in moving forward with this without the commissions willingness to accept it.

Prunty explained this has been done in other instances with historic right-of-ways easements; previous commissions have said the county will not do it ourselves, but if someone else is interested in doing the work a few have gone through in Flathead County.

Prunty sought an answer as to whether the county would be willing to take on the easement if DNRC went through the process.

Commissioner Krueger said further research was needed.
