## Flathead County Septic Permitting Process Checklist: Site Review Path

Return all required paperwork to <u>ehealth@flathead.mt.gov</u> or call 406-751-8130 ext. 5

Submit an application with detailed site plan drawing  o Pay for the application
<ul> <li>Let the County know when the house, well, and drainfield site are staked out</li> <li>Use 4 stakes for each corner of the drainfield, and one stake for the well.</li> <li>Clearly label all stakes and mark them with colorful tape or paint if necessary.</li> </ul>
A County Sanitarian will visit the site to determine approval and draft "Site
Evaluation and Design Report."
<ul> <li>The Sanitarian will be in contact with you if more information is needed.</li> <li>The approved site plan and "Site Evaluation and Design Report" will be sent to the owner and installer via email.</li> </ul>
Give the "Site Evaluation and Design Report" to a certified designer to draft a
pump design.
<ul> <li>Many licensed installers are also certified designers, so check with them first.</li> <li>Local septic tank dealers such as Flathead Concrete or Glacier Precast have a certified installers on staff.</li> </ul>
o The certified designer will submit the pump design to the county.
A county sanitarian will review and approve the pump design and draft the
permit.
An Environmental Health representative will contact you when your permit is
ready.
<ul> <li>Your permit will be issued as soon as it is paid for.</li> </ul>
The septic system shall be installed and inspected within 1 year of the
permit being issued.
<ul> <li>The final inspection is performed by County personnel and shall occur prior to backfilling any portion of the system.</li> </ul>
o Failure to have the system installed and inspected within one year will result in revocation of the permit.
Final approval is given at time of inspection and permit will be finalized by the County.
