What is involved in setting up and managing a plan of care through VDC?

Veterans or their representatives:

- Accept the role of employer.
- Recruit, interview, hire and train in-home caregivers. It is very common for veterans to hire spouses/family members, friends or neighbors.
- Develop a work schedule for the caregiver within the monthly budget allowance.

All veterans in VDC are supported through the Agency on Aging by a VDC Program Care Coordinator and 406 Financial Services, LLC.

The Department of Veterans Affairs determines eligibility and establishes participant budgets.

What is the VDC Program?

VDC empowers Veterans to hire and supervise care providers, to help with daily needs. A Care Coordinator from the Agency on Aging conducts an in-home assessment to determine goods and services needed by each Veteran. Together, the Veteran and Care Coordinator review program guidelines to develop a self directed plan of care based on a monthly budget funded by the VA. The VDC program provides ongoing support to Veterans to manage their plan and meet their personal goals.

Am I eligible?

All VA enrolled veterans, regardless of age, are eligible if they meet the clinical need for the VDC program. The VA Medical Center completes an assessment to determine eligibility and a level of need on which to base the Veteran's monthly budget. The VA then notifies the VDC Program Care Coordinator at the Agency on Aging.

What services are available?

- Assistance with personal care such as bathing, dressing, grooming, medication reminders and toileting.
- Assistance with household tasks such as cleaning, laundry, shopping and meal preparation.
- Help with home modifications, repairs and maintenance to maintain mobility.
- Accompaniment to medical appointments and non-medical transportation.
- ☑ Support, back-up services, purchase of consumable medical supplies such as nutritional supplements or other goods to help Veterans remain at home.
