Summary of Diseases in the State of Montana for Week 13:

- Enteric Diseases: Campylobacteriosis (4), Giardiasis (2), Salmonellosis (3), Shigellosis (2)
- General Communicable Diseases: Coccidioidomycosis (2), COVID-19 (218), Latent TB Infection (LTBI) (3), Streptoccocal toxic-shock syndrome (1)
- Heavy Metal Exposures: Lead (4)
- **Hepatitis:** Hepatitis C, chronic (19)
- STD/HIV: Chlamydia (51), Gonorrhea (10), HIV/AIDS (1), Syphilis, latent (16), Syphilis, primary or secondary (4)
- Vaccine Preventable Diseases: Haemophilus influenzae, invasive (1), Influenza, hospitalization or death (5), Streptococcus pneumoniae, invasive (4)

Mosquitos

- There are over 3,000 mosquito species in the world with over 50 species found in Montana.
- Mosquitos breed in almost every known aquatic habitat except swift currents and in deep open bodies of water.
- Mosquitos undergo complete metamorphosis: egg, larvae, pupae, adult. The first 3 stages can last from 5-30 days depending on water temperature and food availability.
- Only female mosquitos bite as they need blood for egg development.
- Practicing the 3 D's can help prevent and avoid mosquito bites:
 - Dump or cover standing water.
 - Dress in loose, light-colored long sleeves and pants.
 - Defend by using a repellent with a CDC-recommended active ingredient such as DEET, Picaridin, IR3535, or
 Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus.
