Deputy County Attorney

DEFINITION:

Under general supervision, prepares and tries criminal cases and advises County officials on legal matters; assists the other Deputy County Attorneys; does related work as required.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS:

Deputy County Attorneys are primarily assigned to criminal prosecution duties and to providing legal services to County governmental agencies. Assignment to a particular area of service will, to some degree, be based upon the individual's training, experience and specialization. Familiarity and experience with prosecution of both felony and misdemeanor cases is desired. Familiarity and experience with cases involving juvenile crime and dependent neglect is desired. Individuals must also have some background and training for civil litigation with regard to governmental law.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

Prepares criminal cases to which Flathead County is a party for trial or appeal; tries cases in District Court/Justice Court; assists other Deputy County Attorneys in preparing or trying major cases; interviews complainants and witnesses with regard to prospective criminal prosecutions; interviews persons having pertinent information and investigates circumstances, scenes, etc., to gather information necessary for criminal or civil actions; presents cases and interviews witnesses before all courts; prepares pleadings and other legal documents in connection with suits, trials, hearings and other legal procedures; keeps abreast of decisions or laws; provides legal services to County government departments and agencies, such as representing the County in civil actions, advising officers and employees on laws affecting their offices, reviews legislation, prepares contracts and researches legal issues of a civil nature; performs other legal services as needed.

LICENSE:

Active membership in the State Bar of Montana.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Knowledge of:

- Legal principles and their application;
- Rules of evidence and the conduct of court proceedings;
- Techniques of court presentation;
- Techniques of investigation;

Criminal and civil codes of Montana with particular emphasis on the criminal laws;

Legal research methods

Ability to:

Investigate and prosecute criminal complaints;

Present statements of fact, law and argument clearly and logically in written and oral form;

Work cooperatively with others, including various local government boards and commissions;

Draft ordinances, contracts, resolutions and legal instruments;

Graduation from an accredited School of Law; Licensed to Practice in Montana
